Nina obtained her PhD from the Karlsruhe Institute of Technology in 2011, where she studied plasmonic metamaterials and their interaction with semiconductor quantum heterostructures. Afterwards she carried out postdoctoral work at the University of Exeter, working on hybrid systems that combine plasmonic structures and emitters as well as studying microwave metamaterials. In 2016, she left the lab to become an editor at Nature Communications and in 2019 moved to Nature Physics, where she looks after the journal's optical physics brief and the Books & Arts section.
